SWOCC alleged in the letter that the show violated their policy which prohibits drugs of alcohol on the premises.

Taylor said, "Police from Novi bring drugs in to show people all the time. This is content-based discrimination and is patently unfair."

Hills police handing out bike safety helmets

Chief William Dwyer of the Farmington Hills Police Department recently announced the renewal of a program designed to place bicycle safety helmets where they belong, on the heads of boys and girls of Farmington Hills.

The department has purchased a number of helmets that will be distributed to young residents, effective May 10.

The helmets were purchased with block grant funds. Parents who are otherwise unable to provide helmets for their children may request one through this

special program.

The helmets will be distributed at the police department command desk, 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

A parent or legal guardian must accompany any child seeking a helmet and show proof of Farmington Hills residency.

According to the SafeMichigan Partnership, "bicycles are associated with more childhood injuries than any other consumer product except the automobile.


Universal bicycle helmet use

for children aged 4-15 would prevent 136-165 deaths per year."


Dwyer said, "It's easy to see why this issue is of such concern to us. We should all do what we can to ensure that our children are protected."

Last year the Farmington Hills Police Department distributed more than 1,600 helmets to local children.


The helmet giveaway program is the 44th community policing program established by the Farmington Hills Police Department.
