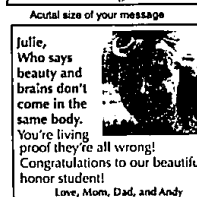
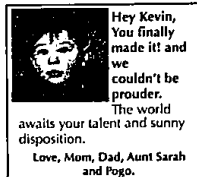

Schrock pitches Hawks to 4-1 win over Patriots

SOFTBALL

Kristin Schrock pitched a two-hitter in softball Monday as visiting Farmington Harrison defeated Livonia Franklin, 4-1.

The victory allowed the Hawks to even their overall record at 11-11. Harrison is 4-4 in the Western Division of the Western Lakes Activities Association.

Schrock struck out 11 and walked three. Harrison had nine hits off Franklin pitcher Nikki Zabkiewicz, who walked two and struck out seven.

Kelly Taylor was 2-for-2 with two RBI and Gayle Ternes 2-for-4 to lead the Hawks.

Harrison scored all of its runs in the second inning — three when Taylor hit a bases-loaded single to right field that was misplayed for an error.

Zabkiewicz singled and scored the Franklin run in the first inning on a throwing error. Amy Sandrick had the other Patriot hit.

In the eight-team Farmington city tournament Saturday, the Hawks won their pool but lost to West Bloomfield in the championship game, 4-3.

The Lakers won it in the bottom of the seventh on a bases-loaded sacrifice fly by Amelia Ariza, who had a two-run triple in the first inning.

West Bloomfield loaded the bases with a double, a single and a walk; Brittany Von Behren beat the throw to the plate after the Ariza flyout.

Taylor's solo homer in the sixth put Harrison on the scoreboard, trailing 3-1.

In the top of the seventh, the Hawks had base hits by Ternes and Merrill DeRose. After a sacrifice bunt by Jacqui Smylie, Ternes scored on Beth Leeb's grounder, and Ellery Diem followed with an RBI single.

Jackie Rosenber pitched a complete game for the Lakers, striking out 10 without issuing a walk.

Schrock went the distance for the Hawks; she had nine strikeouts and two walks. Harrison had a 6-5 edge in hits.

Schrock allowed just three hits as Harrison defeated Farmington Hills Mercy, 3-2.

Schrock struck out nine but

walked seven. The Hawks had five hits, three by Abbey Cleland, who scored a run and knocked in the game-winner in the sixth.

Ternes and Megan Springer also had one RBI each. Mercy scored both runs on a bases-loaded double.

Allen Park defeated Harrison, 5-2, with Leeb taking the loss. Heather Sinawi had an RBI single for the Hawks, who beat Berkley in their last pool game, 7-1.

Schrock went 2-for-4 with a triple and one RBI, scored two runs and was the winning pitcher. Taylor, DeRose and Diem had one hit, one run and one RBI apiece.

Harrison, Mercy and Allen Park finished with 2-1 records in pool play, but the Hawks won a tiebreaker based on fewest runs allowed.

West Bloomfield won the other pool, which included North Farmington, Ypsilanti Lincoln and Farmington.

In a WLA Western Division game Friday, Cleland's RBI single in the 10th inning gave Harrison an 8-7 victory over Northville.

Schrock pitched the whole game, allowing nine hits and 11 walks while striking out seven.

Taylor, Cleland, Schrock, DeRose and Smylie had two hits apiece. Schrock and Ellen Doughty scored two runs apiece.

In the 10th, Sinawi singled and Taylor doubled, putting Sinawi in position to score the winning run on Cleland's hit.

SALEM 5, N. FARMINGTON 1: The Raiders committed nine errors Monday and lost a WLA Lakes Division game to visiting Plymouth Salem.

Each team had six hits, but the Rocks didn't make any errors. Beth Danielewicz was the losing pitcher, Kristin Miller the winner.

Emily Jaffe was 2-for-3 and scored a run for the Raiders, who are 4-2 in the Lakes Division.

Danielewicz doubled to drive in a run; Lindsey Teub also had a ground ball. Hinds and Rust Russell had the other runs. Salem is 4-4 in the division, 15-9 overall.
