13-year-old NFWB Cobras are Early Bird champions

The North Farmington-West Bloomfield Cobras' 13-year-old travel baseball team won its second tournament of the season May 12-13.

The Cobras, who earlier won the Oakland Classic, took a 10-1 overall record into the Northville Early Bird Tournament and finished first with a 4-0 record.

NFWB beat the always-tough South Farmington Blues, 7-1, in the championship game behind the pitching of Cary Pilgion and Brandon Borsen.

Mike Wiseman, Danny Richard and Alan Oaks provided the team's offensive firepower for most of the tournament.

NFWB continued to do well against older competition, finishing second in a 14-and-under tournament at Clarkston May 4-5.

The Cobras, who had a 5-1 tournament record, began with a 14-4 win against the 14-year-old Lake Orion Dragons.

Oaks picked up the win while getting three hits and two RBI. Pilgion and Richard also provided some offensive spark with two hits apiece.

Borsen gained the victory in the second game as NFWB defeated the 14-year-old Anchor Bay Angels, 11-5.

Mike Wiseman picked up three hits while Chad Paul and Kevin Sach added key RBI.

In the third game of the day May 5, Borsen hit a game-winning double and Richard pitched three shutout innings as the Cobras beat the Michigan Rattlers, 2-1.

With the No. 1 seed in their bracket, the Cobras defeated the 14-year-old NFWB travel team in the first playoff game May 6.

Richard and Brad Levick provided three hits apiece in the victory, and Pilgion earned the

pitching win.

In the semifinal game against the 14-year-old Mid Michigan Dirt Dawgs, the Cobras maneuvered their way to a 3-2 win with a key double by Ray Szwak and good defense by Antonio Evangelista, Vinnie Sarafa and Justin Goltz.

The Cobras settled for the runner-up trophy after losing in the final to the 14-year-old Ann Arbor Braves, 9-3.

Four of NFWB's five victories in the tournament were against older teams. The Cobras start league play May 21 and are scheduled to compete in the 13-and-under USSSA World Series Qualifier in Sterling Heights on Memorial Day Weekend.
