The district is allowed \$2,067 per pupil generated by "hold harmless" tax and \$2,294 per pupil from non-homested taxes. An additional \$5,506 in state aid brings the district's total perpupil allowance to \$9,867.

In order to determine tax effects, homeowners can divide

their taxable value by 1,000 and multiply that number by the number of mills levied. According to district budget materials, a property with a taxable value of \$76,000 would pay a total tax bill of \$1,415 for schools-including the 6-mill state levy, the local hold-harmless levy and a 2-mill tax levied for outstanding debt.


