Symptoms: Double vision, droopy eyelids, trouble speaking and swallowing and difficulty breathing. Incubation period: Twelve to 36 hours. Case fatality in the United States is 5-10 per-cent.

Colorridium perfringens: Called the "cafetering germ" because many outbreaks result from food left for long periods of time in steam tables or at room temperature. Source: Soil, dust, sewage, and intestinal tracts of animals and humans. Grows only in little and no oxygen. Symptoms: Diarrhea, nausea and gas pains. Symptoms may persist one to two weeks. Incu-bation period: Six to 24 hours. Shigella: Found in humans intestinal tract; rarely found in aimals.

Surree: People to food through improper food handling. The bacteria multiply rapidly at coms: Severe nausea, abdominal cramps, vomiting and diarrhea. Symptoms can last two to three days, longer if severe dehydra-tion occurs. Incubation period: Thirty minutes to eight hours after eating. For more information on food.
