### OCSD helicopter lands

Oakland County residents will get their first look at sheriff department's new helicopter this week — including a stop at Farmington Hills City Hall.

Two pilots from the department were expected to fly the helicopter back from Dallas, Texas to Oakland County over the weekend, following a week of training at the U.S. offices of the American Eurocopter Corp., a European company headquartered in Marseilles, France.

The first stop — at 10 a.m. Tuesday — is a promotional appearance at WXYZ-TV (Channel 7) in Southfield. After that, Tuesday's tentative, weather-dependent public schedule is:

■ 10:45-11:45 a.m., Memorial Park at Woodward and 13 Mile Road in Royal Oak.

■ Noon to 1 p.m., St. Joseph Catholic School on Lapeer Road in Lake Orion.

■ 1:15-2:15 p.m., Independence Oak County Park in Clarkston.

■ 2:30-3:30 p.m., Community Park at Grand River and New Hudson in Lyon Township.

■ 3:45-4:45 p.m., Farmington Hills City Hall, 31666 W. 11 Mile Road.

The helicopter is the culmination of years of negotiating between the department and the Oakland County Board of Commissioners. One helicopter and two pilots was approved by the board in August, after Sheriff Michael Bouchard outlined how the department could save money by cutting overtime expenses and privatizing food services at the jail.

Commissioners at that time said they would consider a second helicopter providing the department could demonstrate additional cost cuts.

### OU enrollment climbs

Oakland University announced that spring enrollment climbed by eight percent compared to last spring's total. Spring 2001 enrollment totaled 7,133 students, compared to last year's 6,596 students.

Oakland is in the process of building a new Education and Human Services building and new student apartments. Both are scheduled to open in fall 2002.

### OC food bank honored

The Food Bank of Oakland County is the recipient of the 2001 Tim Dinan Community Service Award.

The Oakland County Democratic party first presented this award in 1979. The award recognizes outstanding community service in memory of Tim Dinan, a former politician and devoted community activist.

The Food Bank of Oakland County is one of 189 America's Second Harvest National Food Banks. It serves all of the County's emergency food providers.

### ORCHARD LAKE ROAD

Location: 10 Mile Road to I-696, Farmington Hills.  
Project: Orchard Lake being widened from two lanes to a four-lane boulevard.  
Completion: Nov. 30.

### DUCK LAKE ROAD

Location: Commerce road to Cooley Lake Road, Commerce Township.  
Project: Gravel road to be paved. Road closed to through traffic; detour is Commerce, Burns and Cooley Lake roads.  
Completion: June 30.

### CASS LAKE ROAD

Location: Orchard Lake Road to Otter Street, Keego Harbor.  
Project: Road to be widened to three lanes with improved drainage. Between June 1 and July 27, Cass Lake Road will be closed between Orchard Lake and Hensman/Groves streets.  
Completion: By Nov. 30.

### MIDDLEBELT ROAD

Location: At Long Lake Shores, West Bloomfield Township.  
Project: Road closed so that a hill can be reduced to improve sight distance.  
Completion: June 15.

### HAGGERTY ROAD

Location: Between Hills Tech Street and Grand River, Novi/Farmington Hills.  
Project: Michigan Depart-

ment of Transportation has closed road so that bridges over a freeway can be repaired.  
Completion: Autumn.

### GREEN LAKE ROAD

Location: At Richardson Road, West Bloomfield Township.  
Project: Left-turn lanes being added to this intersection.  
Completion: End of June.

### GREENFIELD ROAD

Location: Eight Mile Road to Nine Mile Road, Southfield/Oak Park.  
Project: Road to be reconstructed. Road will remain open, but alternative routes advised.  
Completion: November.

### LONG LAKE SHORES

Location: North of Bayou Drive, West Bloomfield Township.  
Project: Road closed for bridge replacement. Detour will be posted.  
Completion: June 30.

### 12 MILE ROAD

Location: Taft Road to east of Novi Road, Novi.  
Project: Beginning about May 21, developer widening road to four lanes in conjunction with construction of the Fountainwalk shopping center. Road remains open to traffic, but motorists should expect delays.  
Completion: November.
