

## POLICE CALLS

The following incidents were recently reported to the Farmington Hills Police Farmington Public Safety Department:

## END-OF-SCHOOL MISCHIEF

Three teenagers were reportedly stopped in their tracks while attempting to kick a storm door at about 10:30 p.m. Thursday, June 7, near a residence located in the 32000 block of Queensboro. The boys, 14, of Farmington Hills, 15, of Farmington Hills and 15, of West Bloomfield reportedly told police that they had been walking through the neighborhood kicking landscaping lighting, breaking flower pots, ringing doorbells and kicking doors to scare residents when they were stopped by the homeowner. The teens were handcuffed and transported to the Farmington Hills Police Department, where they were released to their parents' custody.

In an unrelated incident, a school bus driver taking students home about 11 a.m. Thursday, June 7 reported to police that four teenagers were throwing eggs, rocks and spraying water from a large water pistol at passersby by at a location near Ontago and Brandon. The driver told police dispatchers that she was afraid to stop the bus. Police questioned the boys about their activities and they said they were waiting for a friend's brother to get off the bus so they could spray him with shaving cream. They denied throwing anything and no large water pistol was found. They were released to their parents' custody.

An 18-year-old Farmington Hills woman was reportedly injured at a party near 14 Mile

and Middlebelt the night of June 7 after being struck by a brick. She received stitches for the 2-inch gash on the back of her head. The woman reportedly was knocked down by the force of the blow and told police she had no idea who might have thrown it. Also at the party, police recovered a half-full, clear plastic jug of black/grey powder. The Michigan State Police bomb squad detonated the jug, which had been wrapped with black electrical tape, after a Farmington Hills police officer reported that it looked suspicious.

## NARCOTICS VIOLATIONS

A 14-year-old Power Middle School student was taken into custody Tuesday, June 5, after two other students reported seeing the student with marijuana. The student was questioned by the school principal, processed at the Farmington Hills Police Department and released to parents' custody.

Three men were arrested at 10 p.m. Thursday, June 7, following a traffic stop near Grand River and Middlebelt. The driver, a 50-year-old Detroit man, was arrested for carrying a concealed weapon after police found a double-edged dagger concealed in a car seat and for driving with an expired license.

One of his passengers, of undisclosed age and residence, was arrested for possession of heroin after police reportedly found a folded lottery ticket containing heroin on his person. A third passenger, also of undisclosed age and residence, was arrested in connection with a parole violation. A search of the vehicle netted four syringes, four bottle caps with burn marks and one spoon with light burn marks

as well as three syringes concealed in a hole in the driver's seat.

A 19-year-old Farmington Hills man was arrested for possession of marijuana at 12:09 a.m. Friday, June 8, at a 7-11 store located at Nine Mile and Middlebelt. Police reportedly recovered a black box containing .70 grams of marijuana from the woman, who was on probation for retail fraud.

## SUSPENDED LICENSE

A 27-year-old Farmington Hills man was cited for driving with a suspended license 6:07 p.m. Tuesday, June 6, near Inkster and 11 Mile. He had seven previous DWLS violations in Southfield, Ypsilanti, Ann Arbor, Plymouth, Livonia and Redford over the past five years. His license plate was confiscated and replaced with a temporary paper plate.

## DRUNKEN DRIVING

A 45-year-old Farmington Hills man was cited for operating under the influence of liquor and possessing an unlawful blood alcohol level at about 9:24 p.m. Tuesday, June 5, near Eight Mile and Orchard Lake. A police report stated that the officer performed the traffic stop at the man's residence after a brief chase because he was traveling 50 in a 25 mph zone and weaving. A breath test showed a .17 level, exceeding Michigan's legal limit of .10.

A 26-year-old Farmington Hills man was cited for operating under the influence of liquor 9:48 p.m. Wednesday, June 6, outside his residence located in the 30000 block of Perry's Crossing. The man told police that he had consumed 1 1/2 gallons of vodka within the past several

hours and had driven from Madison Heights. A breath test showed a .44 blood alcohol level. Police recovered a half-filled bottle of vodka from the man's vehicle. A police report stated that the man had previous violations for OUIL in October 2000 and for operating while intoxicated in September 1999. His license plate was confiscated.

A 43-year-old Novi man was cited for OUIL Thursday, June 7, after being pulled over for reportedly traveling 55 in a 45 zone on Grand River east of Middlebelt. He reportedly had previous convictions for operating while intoxicated in Novi in 1998 and 1999.

## VANDALISM

Someone dumped paint onto a 2000 Ford Mustang parked in the 21000 block of Ontago sometime before 6:15 Wednesday, June 6. A police report stated that the paint had been spilled onto the car's convertible top, its front left fender and its hood and trunk, causing undetermined damage.

A similar instance of vandalism was reported at another residence in the 21000 block of Ontago at about 8:10 p.m. Wednesday, June 6. A police report stated that the tan-colored paint caused an estimated \$500 damage to the car, a 1994 Chevy Camaro. The vehicle's owner told police he believed a neighbor who "has the hots for his wife" was responsible.

## LARCENIES

Someone reportedly removed a number of valuable items from a 2001 Jeep Wrangler parked at Glen Oaks, 30500 W. 13 Mile, Wednesday, June 6. The vehicle owner told police that someone took a briefcase containing two

passports, checkbook and savings book and a gym bag containing unspecified items. Entry was reportedly gained by unzipping the soft top, though no damage was reported to the vehicle. The briefcase was recovered by Birmingham Police two hours later.

## SHOPLIFTER

Farmington Police were called to the Rite Aid store on Orchard Lake at 10 Mile after a shoplifter dropped the store hand basket tote he was carrying in the parking lot about 8 p.m. June 6.

The tote contained nine bottles of liquor, which the man cushioned with boxes of fabric softener and cotton balls so the bottles wouldn't rattle or break according to a police report.

The pharmacist observed the man and called to the assistant

store manager who ran after the man who dropped the tote because of its weight. The assistant manager didn't pursue the man any but stayed with the store goods.

In another incident, police took three people into custody following a shoplifting incident about 6 p.m. June 4 at the T.J. Maxx Store, 33025 Grand River. Police were called by the store's loss prevention officer. The incident involved switching price tags on a wallet.
