

POLICE AND FIRE CALLS

The following incidents were recently reported to the Farmington Hills Police and Fire Department:

ETHNIC INTIMIDATION

A 39-year-old Farmington Hills man was arrested for ethnic intimidation at 9 p.m. Wednesday, June 13, near the intersection of Shiawassee and Nino Mile, after an altercation with a 32-year-old Detroit woman. A police report stated that the man pulled alongside the woman as she approached the M-5 overpass on Grand River and tried to force her off the road by moving into her lane intentionally. He reportedly told the woman to "go back to Detroit where you belong," adding a couple of racial slurs. The man told

police that the woman had cut him off and that she called him "white trash."

DRUNKEN DRIVING

A 28-year-old New Hudson resident was cited for operating under the influence of liquor, driving with a revoked license and driving a stolen vehicle after being stopped at 9 p.m. Wednesday, June 13, near the intersection of M-5 and Halsted. A Breathalyzer test showed a 0.16 level, exceeding Michigan's legal limit of 0.10.

DRUG ARRESTS

A 21-year-old South Lyon man was cited for possession of heroin and for driving with a restricted license Wednesday, June 13, near Grand River and Halsted. A police search recovered a piece

of paper with suspected heroin folded inside it within his sock and various syringes were recovered from within his vehicle. His passenger, a 20-year-old South Lyon man, was released at the scene.

A 46-year-old Highland man was cited for possession of marijuana at 10:30 p.m. Wednesday, June 13, near the intersection of M-5 and Orchard Lake. A plastic bag containing about 1.6 grams of suspected marijuana was recovered from his pocket. He was also cited for violating a restricted license and for having a loud muffler.

VEHICLE BREAK-INS

Someone reportedly removed a car stereo valued at \$250 and a AC/DC converter valued at \$70 from a Volkswagen Cabriolet convertible parked in the 22000 block of Atlantic Pointe sometime before 8 p.m. Monday, June 11. Entry apparently was gained by cutting through the car's convertible top. A footprint was dis-

covered on a rear seat. A similar incident involving a 1995 Honda Acura was reported

at about the same time and date, also in the 2200 block of Atlantic Pointe. Taken were 200 compact

discs valued at \$4,000. Entry was reportedly gained by using a "slim jim" prying device. The car's alarm was not triggered during the break-in because the battery was disconnected.

Someone threw a rock through a rear window of a GMC Jimmy parked in the 30000 block of Knighton some time before Wednesday, June 13. The vehicle's owner told police that they thought they heard an explosion at about 11:30 p.m. on June 12.

The fire caused an estimated \$180,000 in damage and burned through the electrical supply to the home, which landed in the back yard.
