

## POLICE REPORTS

The following incidents were recently reported to the Farmington Hills Police and Farmington Public Safety Departments:

### PEEPING, FLASHING TOM

A woman living in the 26000 block of Independence Drive told police that a white male looked at her from outside two separate windows while she was inside her apartment. The first time she told police, the man peeked at her from a bedroom window after she had gotten out of the shower. The second time he peeked at her from a living room window and reportedly had his pants down around his ankles and fondled his genitals.

Police are investigating, because of a similar incident reported in the area last month.

### DOMESTIC ASSAULT

A 30-year-old Farmington Hills man was arrested at 2:33 a.m. Saturday, July 7 for domestic assault at a residence in the 27000 block of Gateway following an incident with his wife, also 30. A police report stated that the pair began arguing over his relationship with a female co-worker, whom the wife accused of having an affair with

him. During the argument, he reportedly shoved her into a mirror and pushed her head into a cat litter pan. The man told police that she had threatened him with a knife. Two of the couple's children were reportedly in the home during the incident.

### DISORDERLY CONDUCT

A 21-year-old Redford man was arrested for disorderly conduct and possession of narcotic paraphernalia Saturday, July 7 at a residence located in the 27000 block of Independence. Police recovered a pipe, believed to be used for smoking narcotics, during a search of his person. Police were responding to a report of an unruly, loud, unwanted guest in the home, occupied by a 46-year-old Farmington Hills woman.

### SLEEPING CLERK, LARCENY

Several items were reportedly taken from a Mobil gas station convenience store at 29509 Orchard Lake while a clerk was apparently sleeping on the job. The larcenies apparently occurred Wednesday, July 4 but were reported Sunday, July 8. A surveillance camera captured images of the sleeping clerk.

Some items taken included key chain lights, two packs of gum, an 89 cents bag of pretzels, and several other small items. Police are reviewing surveillance tapes.

### MAILBOXES DESTROYED

Police took several reports of destroyed mailboxes over the past weekend. Incidents were reported in the 31000 block of Claymore; the 22000 block of Canfield, in which a plastic pop bottle containing aluminum foil and sulfuric acid was also found at the scene; and the 30000 block of Fox Club.

### DRUG ARRESTS

A 31-year-old Farmington Hills man was arrested for possession of marijuana and cited for having a defective brake lamp at 3:27 a.m. Saturday, July 7 near Tulane and Grand River after being pulled over for a defective light. He reportedly consented to a vehicle search and told police that there was marijuana in the vehicle's console. Police recovered 6.5 ounces of marijuana from the console. The police report stated that there was a strong odor of marijuana coming from his vehicle.

A 53-year-old Farmington

Hills woman was cited for possessing narcotics and paraphernalia at 9:42 a.m. Saturday, July 7 following a traffic stop at Eight Mile and Orchard Lake. The vehicle's driver was cited for having a loud exhaust system.

### STOLEN LIQUOR?

The manager of the Farmer

Jack store at 22128 Farmington Road called police just after midnight July 9 because he believed four teens stole a bottle of liquor.

Though he didn't actually see them take it, he told police he saw them in the store previously and they acted suspiciously. The teens from Southfield left the Farmer Jack store and went to

the nearby 7-Eleven Store on Farmington Road where police interviewed them.

They told police they hadn't taken anything and police found nothing on them.

Per the store manager, police informed the teens they were no longer welcome at the Farmer Jack store and if they returned,
