For those who do contract a fungus or virus, Solomon recommends lightly spraying the inside of all shoes with Lysol.

That cuts down the volume of the virus or the fungus, he said, emphasizing their ability to develop into secondary bacterial infections. "Prompt treatment is recommended."

Foot care from page D4 "It takes a couple of months for them to develop," he said. They start off as painful calluses. But, they're actually different from a callus because they'll have little speckled areas in what would appear to be a callus. That's actually the virus. The wart virus causes hemorrhaging of the capillary ends of the skin. That's what forms sort of 'peppery' looking lesions on the bottom of the foot." Take heart You don't have to swaddle your natty nails and closed-toe shoes necessarily. "When people are done with their activities, they need to wash their feet," Solomon said. "It's really basic hygiene. Keep them clean and use a little bit of powder on the feet to absorb excessive perspiration that occurs."

Wearing sandals or going bare-ot in warm weather is great for foot in warm weather is great for airing the feet, yet this freedom has its health risks, too. "It poses an increased ability

has its health risks, too.

"It poses an increased ability of contracting fungus infections of the feet and nails and also warts," said Marshall G. Solomon, a podiatrist with the Foot Care Institute of Michigan in Farmington Hills.

"Fungus is easily picked while walking barefoot. It's a normal skin contaminant. What happens is that the pil of the skin changes when feet become moist and warm. When the pil changes, the fungus becomes opportunistic and can invade the underlying skin tissues."

Symptoms begin with itching and cracking between the toes and gradually spread to the soles and sides of the feet. It becomes a chronic problem once the fungus reaches the toennils.

"A wart is a virus and is more common in younger children than in adults," Solomon said. "It's usually contracted when they're out around pools and in shower rooms."

The virus may be contracted during the summer, but symptoms may not show up until fall.

Make a plan to care for pets in the event of an evacuation or extended time away from your home.

Practice your plan. Run your family through a disaster drill - eappecially if you have young children - and provide a refresher course about every six months or so. Pick a safe zone in your house and practice sitting there together. You may also want to take advantage of the opportunity to practice getting out of your home in the event of an evacuation.

Assemble a disaster supply kit. This kit should include items like a flashlight, extra batteries, bottled water, non-perishable food, a can opener, a first aid kit, a battery-operated radio and blankets. Keep food items in airtight plastic bags and check your food and water supply every six months to make sure they remain fresh.

Secure important family and financial documents. If a storm strikes suddenly, you won't have time to search for important papers. Gather critical documents and store them in a secure, easily accessible location known to'all family members. Include wills, insurance policies, contracts, deeds, investments, passports, social security cards, immunization records, bank accounts, credit card accounts,

inventory of valuable household goods, important telephone numbers and family birth, marriage and death certificates.
