 The Cobras achieved the perfect season by defeating Lincoln Park, 10-0. Matt Petry had two hits, which brought in three runs, and Ben Darga and Doug Pickens scored three runs each.
 Dan Graham and Neil Sternberg combined their pitching talents for the shutout.
 In its previous game, NFWB blanked Birmingham for the third consecutive time, 12-0. Darga and Winger shared the pitching duties.
 Every player in the Cobras lineup had at least one hit. Nick Vitamis, Kevin Zerbo, Bryan Smith, Andy Winger and Sternberg had two apiece.
 The Cobras defeated the second-place Michigan Rams, 8-2. Petry went the distance on the mound, scattering four hits on the way to his sixth victory.
 Pickens swung the hot bat, going 3-for-3 with three RBI, and

scoring three runs. Zerbo, Darga and Vitamis contributed two hits each.
 The biggest offensive output of the year came at the expense of the (Dearborn) Michigan Hawks as the Cobras pounded the opposition, 20-6.
