A warrant was issued Wednesday for Seaton, who was expected to be arraigned Thursday in 47th District Court. Anticipated charges are related to two burglaries reported July 13 in Farmington Hills.
Seaton was arrested at 8 p.m. Thursday, at Puritan and the Lodge Freeway in Detroit. Dwyer said Hills detectives and officers from the South Oakland Narcotice Intelligence Consortium (Farmington Hills, West Bloomfield and Novi Police and Oakland County Sheriff's officers) were assisted by the Alliance Fugitive Task Force, which includes the Detroit Police Department, Michigan State Police and the F.B.I.
