Bill would protect fathers' rights

Single fathers in Michigan may stand a better chance at playing an important role in their children's lives under legislation unanimously approved by the state House that prohibits anyone from deceiving the state during adoption proceedings.

House Bill 4638 prohibits Michigan residents from knowingly misidentifying someone as the biological father of a child undergoing adoption. Violators would be guilty of a misden meanor punishable by imprisonment for up to two years or a fine of up to \$1,000.

"Hidding the true identity of a carring father so he can't affect

"Hiding the true identity of a caring father so he can't affect the adoption process is not in the best interest of the child," said Andrew Raczkowski, R-Farmington Hills. "Men have a

fundamental right to know if
they fathered children, and
deserve a voice in the decisionmaking process if adoption is
being considered."
The initiative makes it harder
to terminate parental rights of
unwel fathers, allows courts to
order genetic testing in out-ofwellow adoption proceedings
and permits men to seek cancellation of their child support payments if they can prove they are
not a child's biological father.
Under HB 4638, people could
not deceiv he courts, state
Family Independence Agency, a
child placing agency or an
interested party regarding the
child's biological father.
HB 4638 now goes to the Senate for consideration.
