Sec. 1. Any person desiring to make drainage connections with the village sewers, shall first make application to the village clerk for apprication to the vininge cierk for said connection. On payment of one dollar for each and every connection, written permission will be given by said clerk. All connections are to be made under the under the superviside of the attention. under the supervision of the street commissioner—expense of the same to be paid by the property owner

Sec. 2. Any person or persons violating the provisions of this ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof, be punished by a fine not to exceed five dollars or imprison ment not exceeding five days in the county jail, or both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court together with the cost of productions.


