

Shamrocks use memory of semifinal loss as motivation

One play.
A wind gust from right to left instead of left to right.

That's what kept Redford Catholic Central out of the Division 1 state final last year, when a steady wind pushed a 67-yard field goal try to the right, giving the Shamrocks a 14-13 semifinal loss to Utica Eisenhower.

And that one play is something CC coach Tom Mach said stayed with his team through the year and can carry over to this season.

"I thought we could've won it last year and hope the kids feel they have something to prove and go out and do it," said Mach, whose team finished 10-3 overall and 3-1 in the Catholic League Central Division. "When you get as close as we did, get down to the final play, you remember

that and hope it carries over." It might be tough to do for the Shamrocks as they return just four starters on offense and only two on defense.

"We're filling in a lot of spots on defense," said Mach. "We've got nine guys who are trying to fill positions. I think with repetition, we'll be good, but we need the reps. Offensively, we have two starters back on the line, and the guys we have filling in need work. It's hard to say how good we are when we're only blocking ourselves in practice."

But the Shamrocks also return key elements in quarterback Tom Jakacki and running back Mike Banaszak.

"I think you're always happy when your quarterback returns with a year experience," said Mach. "Tom did a good job last

year, and that's going to help this year. He can run, he can throw and do an awful lot of things that can hurt teams."

Banaszak, who gained nearly 900 yards, is joined in the backfield by junior Randall Means, senior Ryan Rogowski and Derrick Brooks, the only sophomore to make the varsity.

CC has a few receivers who saw playing time in senior Ryan Wroblewski and Jeff McMichael and junior Landon Langham. Tom Michaelson and Brett Smith are the tight ends.

The returning starters on the line are senior tackles Mike Farnick and Jeff Globish, although Globish will move to center.

Guard Brad Jarzembowski saw plenty of time last year. Matt Kato and Jim Wood will take care of the left side of the line at guard and tackle, and Greg Arrowsmith and Rick Thompson will see time in the front line.

On defense, Blain Nayemith will start at noseguard, Globish and Farnick at the tackles, Mike Clary, John Foley and Sean Clements will be in the mix at outside linebacker, while Rogowski and Jarzembowski will start at inside linebacker.

The secondary is steady with Wroblewski, Means, Kevin McKee and Jakacki.

"One thing I think we do have is good chemistry, and I'm happy with our work ethic," said Mach, whose team opens Saturday afternoon against Traverse City West at the Silverdome. "They get along well; they're willing to work hard."

The Central Division could be wide open, too, between CC, Division 2 champion Brother

Rice, always-strong Orchard Lake St. Mary and last year's sleeper University of Detroit-Jesuit.

"It's hard to pick a favorite, but I always pick ourselves just because," said Mach. "I'm not sure there's a dominant team, but there are plenty of good ones. We've got as good of a chance as anyone."

Western in the WLLA Western Division opener in the third game.

"Obviously, the potential is there," Herrington said. "I don't think we have the depth we had or the speed on defense, but the potential is there and, hopefully, we can live up to (the No. 1 rating)."

YEAR IN REVIEW: Harrison players racked up some big numbers on offense last year, and had some impressive stats on defense, too. Here's a recap of what the top returning players did a year ago.

Drew Stanton passed for 1,911 yards, completing 98 of 140 attempts (school record 70 percent) for 25 touchdowns with only four interceptions.

He rushed for four TDs, punted for a 37.2 average and led the team with four interceptions while making 30 tackles. Agim Shabal caught 42 passes for 785 yards and 11 touchdowns. He was 11-of-21 passing for 336 yards and four TDs, and he carried the ball 44 times for 415 yards and five TDs. He also returned punts and kickoffs.

Terrell Mayberry had 12 pass receptions for 460 yards and five TDs. He returned 10 kickoffs for an average of 30.8 yards and one TD. He intercepted two passes and made 36 tackles. Dave Condoni caught 14 passes for 333 yards and four TDs. He was tied for fifth place on the team with 68 tackles, and he had three interceptions.

Marcus Woods rushed for 1,540 yards and scored 28 touchdowns while averaging 6.1 yards per carry. He also returned punts and kickoffs.

All five players made the All-Observer first team. Aaron Kennedy was a member of the second team.

Herrington has a career record of 285-58-1, including a 50-4 mark over the last four seasons. The Hawks have also played in a record 14 state championship games.
