The Southwestern Oakland Cable Commission (SWOCC) has always felt that Access TV is important and has continued to make provisions for it in the cable franchise agreement with Time Warner Cable. But this isn't only a local issue.

FCC Commissioner, Gloria Tristani spoke at this Alliance for Community Media conference singling the praises of Access TV: "At its most basic, PEG access empowers individuals and groups to use the media to educate and enrich their communities. It is television by the people and for the people. It represents the purest form of media democracy.

Tristani expressed her concern
over the consolidation of the
radio, television, telephone and

Telecommunications Act eliminated limits on national radio
