Don't wait to get your flu shot

Along with the holidays, the flu season is just around the corner. Why risk being in bed when you could be basting your turkey and entertaining your guests.
"We've received an additional 300 doses this year. It is especially important for seniors to get their vaccination, especially if they have history of chronic medical problems. We are seeing occasional cases of the flu already," said Dr. Mohammed Ariswala, medical director.
The flu and the pneumonia vaccines are covered by Medicare. Cost for non-Medicare patients is \$15 for the flu vaccine and \$45 for pneumonia.
Livonia Urgent Care is located in the Mis-

sion Health Building, Seven Mile Road and Newburgh, Livonia. Call (734) 642-6100.
The Westland Fire Department and Oakwood Hospital, in cooperation with the Friendship Center, will offer flu shots. The event, 9:15 a.m. to noon Monday, Nov. 5, is open to Westland seniors age 65 or older.
If you have traditional Medicare, shots are free. For all others, the charge is \$10. Registration should be done at the front desk of the center or by phone, (734) 722-7632. The center is at 1119 N. Newburgh in Westland.
Garden City Hospital will be administering flu shots 1:30-5:30 p.m. Friday, Oct. 12, in the medical office building.

Shots also will be offered 8:30-11:30 a.m. and 1:30-3:30 p.m. Tuesday, Oct. 16, at the Harrison Center on Harrison and Maplewood. Other dates will be available later in the month.
Advance appointments are required and can be made by calling 468-4330.
St. Mary Mercy Hospital is offering flu shots from October 24 through November 20. There is a \$15 fee for the shot, free for those with proof of Medicare B. Please call Community Outreach at (734) 655-8940 for an appointment or for more information. St. Mary Mercy Hospital is located at 36475 Five Mile in Livonia.
