new ordinance.

"There's people that have lived here eight years who said there have never been horses as long as they've been here," Argue said.

"After a month or so of stalling me, they finally said anyone in Farmington Hills can have horses as long as they have two acres," she continued.

Argue shows written communications from city staff.

"It's all really confusing, there are state non-conformity laws, grandfather—it's crazy."

"We'll take another look at it," Mayor Nancy Bates responded.

The mayor said staff research shows the horses are allowable by ordinance. "My own suspicion is they're not allowed to offend our blight ordinance," she said, adding an offensive smell could be regulated under that ordinance.

Bates said a zoning department staff member would return to the site. "She is a citizen that deserves a follow up."

The owners of the horses could not be reached for comment Friday.
