passed four times in the flat to Shabai, who scored on a 7-yarder with 45 seconds remaining.

Shabai appeared to be stopped at the 2, but he spun away from the defender and lunged forward, reaching over the goal line with the ball.

"They played off our receivers quite a bit and we were able to get the ball out and do some good things," Herrington said. "We just have some players who are playmakers."

"They have a good quarterback, a good receiver — and that defensive line is no joke either," Durrett said. "They controlled the ball, and we had to control the offense. That's the only way

you're going to beat a team like that."

The Trojans (11-1) scored on their first two possessions of the second half, but they were using time, too, and the clock wasn't working in their favor.

Charleston Hughes capped an 80-yard drive with an 11-yard run to make it 24-6, but the Hawks answered with another touchdown.

Shabai ran 31 yards on a reverse, Dave Condemi caught a 22-yard pass from Stanton and Woods ran the final 5 yards for his second TD with 3:18 to play in the third. Klosterman's kick gave Harrison a 31-6 lead.

Carruth, who was 5-of-11 pass-

ing for 88 yards in the second half but 8-of-20 for 95 yards overall, scrambled for a 12-yard TD run on the final play of the third quarter. Jackson ran for the two points and a 31-14 tally.

"We slowed it down a little in the second half," Herrington said. "The second half was kind of a blur. We took the air out of the ball, and we probably shouldn't have."

"We just didn't want to get an interception. We didn't want to give them the ball again too quickly, because they were fired up. And then they scored again on fourth-and-10."

"Part of it was the doctor said we shouldn't have (Stanton) doing the deep dropback, because (Saginaw defensive end Lamar) Woodley was getting to him."

Woodley is a 6-foot-2, 230-pound junior and a future, big-time college prospect who had 16 tackles.


"We didn't know what to do with him," Herrington said. "Do you run at him so he doesn't kill you on the backside or run away from him?"

"They had Woodley running all day and wore him out in the first half," Durrett said. "They made him chase the quarterback, and he was worn out over on the sideline."

Shabai had two interceptions and caught seven passes for 56 yards. Stanton was 12-of-19 for 135 yards. Jamie Cook had the fourth interception.

The Trojans had a 197-178 edge in running yards, but the Hawks had the advantage in total yards, 313-292.

DeMarcus Luray (50) and Hughes (35) combined for 85 rushing yards in the second half, and Anthony Hobson had four receptions for 76 yards in the second half.

seconds left in the period.

Mendosa, who had 85 yards in seven first-half carries, followed with a 3-yard TD run at 11:02 left to make it 20-3.

Pete Shaw added a 2-yard TD sneak with 4:27 to go until intermission and Tim Shaw made it a 30-point bulge with 1:53 left in the half on a 40-yard run.

Capac got down to the Clarenceville 5 just before the half, but Glenn Garrant intercepted a Lewis pass with just 10 seconds left to stop the threat.

In the second half, Clarenceville's defense showed renewed vigor, holding Capac to minus-6 yards in the third quarter.

Shaw then scored on a 14-yard TD run with 6:57 to go in the third to force the 35-point mercy rule and a running clock.

The Trojans back-up quarterback Josh Silvernail contributed a 1-yard TD sneak in the final period to push the margin to 46-3. (Silvernail also had an interception during the quarter.)

Capac got its lone TD with only 54 seconds remaining on a 14-yard pass from Lewis to Stuver.

Pete Shaw, a junior quarterback, hit six of eight passes for 91 yards. Meanwhile, Tim Shaw

also had four catches out of the backfield for 63 yards, while Mendosa caught two for 33.

"Our offensive line got off the ball a lot better than last week (a 22-16 win over Detroit Crockett)," Hudkins said. "That's a quality football team (Capac), but offensively we moved the ball pretty well."

Shaw now has 135 career TDs

and 7,729 career rushing yards, both state records. He has 2,520 rushing yards this season, including 1,016 in four playoff games.

"You try and take away Shaw and they hurt you with somebody else," said Capac coach Matt Topic, whose team bowed out at 10-3 overall. "They're a great team and they deserve to be where they're at."

"Some backs are fast and some backs are strong, but he (Shaw) has the whole package. He does such a good job setting up his blocks and finding those open spaces. We'll see him somewhere playing on Saturday."

Clarenceville limited Gino Mallo, a 1,600-yard rusher, to only 45 yards in nine carries. The Chiefs had 183 total yards, 91 on the ground, 92 in the air.
