"It was really a 3-1 game," Harris said. "It was a good effort, but we came up a little short."

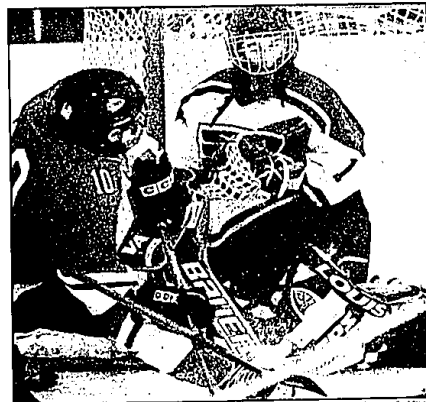
Farmington's statistician had the Flyers outshooting the Chiefs 14-2 in the first period, 16-7 in the second and 14-5 in the third.

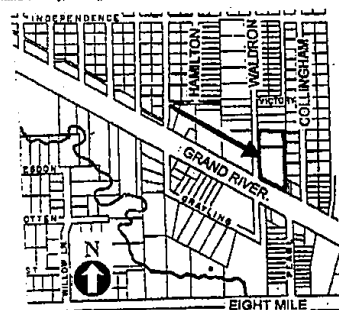

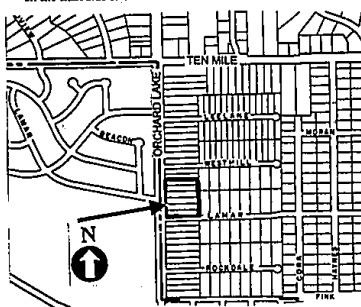
