

When forming a supergroup with 15 musicians, getting the entire band together to perform a show sounds impossible. The Reindeer Section hasn't appeared live with a complete line up yet. Featuring various a members from Glaswegian darlings like Mogwai, Belle and Slobastian, Arab Strap, Eva and Astrid, and the brainchild of Snow Patrol's Gary Lightbody, the band londs liteli more easily to a studio project. And its music can stand alone.

On Ya'll Get Scared Now, Ya Hear' Lightbody intrigues, rather than frightens. It all began when he approached friends in the Glasgow music zeno in the middle of a Lou Barlow gig. "We were all out one night and I said 'Let's make a record.' I don't think anyone anyected anything to happen. The next day, I wrote the record and we went in and did it."

Now, Lightbody said, "I don't know what I'd do without it - listening to it, playing it. I love everything."
