

Zebras prevail while Opett spurs Patriots

Wayne Memorial opened Mega Conference Red Division play with a 64-52 boys basketball victory Friday at home against Romulus.

Wayne is 2-1 overall and 1-0 in the Mega-Red, while Romulus falls to 0-3 and 0-1.

The Zebras overcame a 9-2 first-quarter deficit. They outscored the Eagles 44-26 in the second half.

"It was a big win," Wayne coach Wayne Woodard said. "We got off to a rocky start, but the kids hung in here."

"We just played a little better in the second half. I told the kids, 'You're acting like you don't want to be out there. You're varsity basketball players.'"

"FRANKLIN 48, THURSTON 37: Derek Opett, a 6-foot-2 junior forward, poured in a career-high 27 points Friday, including 14 in the third quarter to lead host Livonia Franklin (1-3) past Redford Thurston (2-1).

Franklin trailed 11-2 after one quarter and 23-14 at halftime, but the Patriots roared back with a 20-9 third quarter run followed by a 14-5 fourth-quarter surge.

Junior Chris Austin grabbed 14 rebounds, while Chad Reed had eight assists.

Opett's scoring was the difference. "Derek hit open shots and hit baskets in transition," Franklin coach John Santi said.

Matt Rodriguez led Thurston with 18 points.

•REDFORD CC 70, O.L. ST. MARY 62:

Jeff Niemiec's three-pointer during the last second of regulation moved the game into overtime and allowed coach Rick Corretti's Shamrocks to beat Catholic League Central Division foe Orchard Lake St. Mary.

It was 54-all at the end of regulation. CC then outscored host Orchard Lake 15-5 in overtime.

In the first quarter, Redford Catholic Central led 22-16 before half-time St. Mary came back to score 10 more points than their opponents.

Leading scorers for CC (2-0) included Tom Jakacki (17 points) and Ryan Wroblewski (15).

John Andrew led the Eagles (1-1) with 18 points and Robert Jolly added 17.

•GREENHILLS 59, CLARENCEVILLE 58: Jesse Dixon's only basket of the game with only 1.5 seconds proved to be the difference Friday as host Ann Arbor Greenhills (2-1) nipped Livonia Clarenceville (1-3).

Clarenceville led 26-22 at intermission.

Bruce Svecchota, who had 16 points, had the game-winning assist. Alex McEachern added 12 for Greenhills.

Senior forward Tim Shaw finished with 23 points on 12-of-18 shooting along with 12 rebounds and 11 steals. Junior Glenn Garratt added 18 points, while Pete Shaw had eight on 4-of-5 shooting.

"We played with a lot of poise and we learned a lot tonight," Clarenceville coach Kevin Murphy said. "We just need to take that next step."

•INTER-CITY 64, LUTHERAN WESTLAND 43: On Friday, host Allen Park Inter-City Baptist (3-0) pulled away in the final period to earn the non-conference victory over Lutheran High Westland.

Inter-City led 40-35 after three quarters before going on a 24-8 fourth-quarter run by hitting four 3-pointers.

Ben Dawson had seven of his game-high 21 points in the final period. Josh Claypool added a pair of treys of his 14 during the surge, while Jeremy Rayburn had six of his 11.

Brent Heblitz and John DeVries each

scored 10 for the Warriors.

DeVries also grabbed 18 rebounds. •GREATER LIFE 72, HURON VALLEY 63: Daniel Varnell scored 27 points to lead Pontiac Greater Life to the non-conference win Thursday over visiting Westland Huron Valley Lutheran (0-5).

Greater Life took a 36-27 halftime lead and played the Hawks even in the second half, 36-all.

Josh Revez added 10 points for Greater Life, which hit 51 percent of its shots from the field.

Sophomore guard Matt Kubik had 17 to lead the Hawks. Junior guard Dan Schultz added 15, while junior forward Dave Anderson had 13 points and 10 rebounds.

On Tuesday, Huron Valley lost at Flint-Michigan School for the Deaf, 57-40, as Mike Takacs led the victorious Tartars with 11.

Jacob Bartholomew had 22 for Huron Valley and Anderson added 10.

CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS OAKLAND COUNTY, MICHIGAN ZONING AMENDATORY ORDINANCE ORDINANCE NO. C-12-2001

An Ordinance to amend the City Code, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, of the City of Farmington Hills, to amend Section 34.32 to reclassify certain property as hereinafter mentioned:

The City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan, hereby ordains:

Section 1. That the City Code of the City of Farmington Hills, Chapter 34, Zoning Chapter, is hereby amended in part to amend Section 34.32 to reclassify certain property in the City as follows: to show D-3 District classification where L-1, Light Industrial District classification is now shown in the area described as follows:

Sidwell #23-19-325-031

A part of Section 19, T1N, R9E, City of Farmington Hills, Oakland County, Michigan. The property concerned is located on the northeast corner of Grand River and Crestview.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Section 3. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect twenty-one days after their enactment.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared to have been adopted by the Council Members of the City of Farmington Hills, at a duly called meeting held on the 10th day of December, 2001, and ordered to be given public publication in the manner prescribed by law.

CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE

Notice of Adoption of Ordinance C-12-01, an Ordinance to amend Chapter 34, Zoning, Section 34-539, of the City Code, relating to accessory buildings and structures, in order to increase setbacks relating to rear and side lot lines and to increase the permitted size of accessory uses and buildings.

A full copy of this Ordinance is on file in the Clerk's Office for public review and inspection.

THE CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS ORDAINS:

Section 1.

The Farmington Hills City Code, Chapter 34, Zoning, Article XXII, General Provisions, Section 34-539, Accessory Buildings and Structures, Subsection (b)(2), is hereby amended to read as follows:

(b)(2) Detached accessory buildings or structures shall not be located within six (6) feet of any rear lot line and shall not be located closer to any side lot line than the minimum side yard setback required in the district.

Section 2.

The Farmington Hills City Code, Chapter 34, Zoning, Article XXII, General Provisions, Section 34-539, Accessory Buildings and Structures, Subsection (b)(4), is hereby amended to read as follows:

(b)(4) In no instance shall the combined floor area of all accessory uses and buildings exceed sixty (60) percent of the ground floor area of the residential dwelling unit or seven hundred fifty (750) square feet, whichever is greater.
