WHITE PLAGUE LESS DEADLY

Decrease in Death Rate From Tuber culosis Means Saving of 27,000 Lives in Ten Years

In the decade from 1901 to 1910, the death rate from tuberculosis in the United States declined from 1983 for each 190,000 persons living to 1003, 3 decrease of 16.7 per cent, while the general death rate flat only one-half as fast, or at the rate of 9.7 per cent, from 16550 to 1458, according to figures given out by the National Association for the Study and Prevention of Tuberculosis. The figures are based on data abstracted from the reports of the United States Bureau of the Census, and cover the registration area in this country.
