# Farmington forms brownfield authority

At their regular meeting Monday, officials approved a "brownfield authority," which will allow them to designate contaminated sites as eligible for financial selectories and the selectories.

Frank Lauhoff said there are two areas that "may need help."
They suspect an abandoned gas station behind Benchmark in downtown Farmington and a location behind Farmer Jack at Nino Mile and Farmington Roads will be eligible.

"The City of Farmington is an older community that is continuing to roview opportunities to assist in redevelopment of conservation and industrial areas of the city," Lauhoff said.

"It is important that the city take advantage of any opportunity that could assist financially or physical elements are removed.
