A living legend of the Detroit jazz community, Marcus Belgrave originally relocated to Detroit in the 1960s to be staff trumpater at Motown Studies. He has performed and recorded with such illustrious stars as Ella Fitzgorald, Max Rous Bella Fitzgorald, Max Ronartor, Tony Bennett, Aretha Franklin and Dizzy Gillespis, to name a few. Belgrave performs around the world at lazz festivals, premier jazz clubs and concert hals, and tours with the Lincoln Center Jazz Orchestra each year. In addition, he is co-founder of the jazz studies program at the Detroit Metro Arts Complex, was a faculty member for Oakland University's jazz studies program, and was founder of the Jazz Development Workshop in Detroit.
