## Moffitt expected to serve as vice chair Chamber from page A1



While it's going to be a busy couple of months, Flaharty may be out of the office quite a bit. In December, she was diagnosed with Hodgkin's lymphoma. But she's quick to add her dectors have said the disease is treatable and curable.

A round of chemotherapy will begin soon, followed by radiation treatments.

"I'm as upbeat today as I was the end of Novomber, before I knew I had it," she said.

She found out in an odd way, after having a few health problems into last year. Flaharty came down with a cold that just wouldn't go away and noticed three swollen nodes on her neck. Her dector thought the two might be related and gave her an antibiotic.

Over the following weekend, she developed a lump the size of an orange. Flaharty spent the next week in the hospital, having tests and biopsies. Dectors found a three-inch tumer in the center of her chest.

"I only worked five days in December, and I don't think anyone knew it," she laughed. "We didn't miss a beat."

Since news of her illness started traveling, Flaharty has been overwhelmed by the support she's received from the commu-

nity. But the most heart-warming outcome has been getting to know more about her paternal grandmother, who died of lymphoma before Flaharty was born. There are parallels in their related diseases and in the fact that her grandmother died in December, the same month Flaharty was diagnosed. While she

keeps a journal through her ill-ness, her father has started a journal about her grandmother's life.

In typical fashion, Flaharty intends to work as much as she can, even through treatments if she's feeling well enough.

"I'm staying positive," she said.
