body temperature to a subnor-mal level. It occurs when a person's body cannot produce enough energy to keep the inter-nal body temperature warm enough. Heart failure is often enough. Heart failure is often the cause of death in cases of hypothermia.

Besides cold temperature, high winds, snow and rain also can

steal away body heat. Wind is especially significant because removes the layer of air that body has heated.

At 30 degrees Fahrenheit in a 20-mile-per-hour wind, the cooling effect is equal to calm air at four degrees. Similarly, dampness causes body heat to be lost more rapidly than it would be at the same ambient temperature.
