Harrison had balanced scoring with only one player in double figures. Joe McElroy and Stevenson's Linden Ivesley shared game-high scoring honors with 12 points each. Dave Condeni and Matt Elsey added nine apiece for the Hawks. Terrill Mayberry eight, Mike Bartley six and Jeff Ross five.

Condeni also had nine rebounds, McElroy eight, Ross six and Mayberry five. Mayberry had four assists and three steals.

"When we get the touches on offense that we like to get, we should spread it around," Turnquist said.

Nicholas Ehlenstedt tossed in 10 points for Stevenson, Brandon Chitwood nine, John Rehberg and Brady Crosby four apiece.

After an early 2-0 deficit, the Hawks led the entire first half and had their biggest lead late in the second quarter, 28-21. They settled for a four-point margin at halftime, 29-25, after Ivesley and Scott Brodie made two free throws each in the last two minutes.

The Spartans took the lead twice in the third quarter, the last time at 36-36 on a bucket by Rehberg with 2:16 remaining.

Harrison finished the period with a McElroy layup and three points by Condeni to regain the lead, 40-38.

"That's the type of pulse you want from a senior-laden group," Turnquist said, adding the Hawks might not have responded as well to that situation earlier in the season.

The Hawks seemed to have the game under control, leading 50-42 with under two minutes left.

But the Spartans forced two turnovers, and Crosby converted each time to make it a four-point game with a half minute to play. Mayberry's free throws and Elsey's layup iced the win for Harrison.

"(The Spartans are) a very solid team," Turnquist said. "They have a handful of good, all-around basketball players."

They execute very well and certainly can cause you some problems. Billy has done a great job with this group."

Harrison made 22 of 56 field goals with two threes and eight of 16 free throws. Stevenson was 20-of-58 from the field and 6-of-8 at the line.

"They just kept us at bay," Dyer said. "It seemed they out-

hustled us to every loose ball. We took the lead in the third, but down the stretch they were just tougher. They beat us all the way around."

The Spartans will try to get back on track Friday when they play at Salem.

N. FARMINGTON 68, CHURCHILL 52: Senior Mike Leach and freshman Sean Mackler scored 18 points apiece Tuesday to lead host North Farmington to the WLLA win.

Mackler's point total was a career high; he also had eight rebounds to share team-high honors with Earle Higgins, Jr.

Higgins also had six points and Leach six rebounds. Andy Zak chipped in seven points and Marcus McComb five for the Raiders (4-4, 6-7).

McComb, the team's point guard, played less than a third of the game due to foul trouble. Jason Neal took over at the point, which affected his scoring output, but he saw the Raiders through the game.

North led 8-3 after one quarter, 28-22 at halftime and 48-35 going into the fourth period.

Jerry Murray scored 12 points to lead Livonia Churchill (2-6, 4-9); Kevin Zelnick and Hassan Jaffer added eight points each.

The Raiders made 20 of 26 free throws; the Chargers were 15-of-21 at the line.

"It wasn't real artistic, but we played really hard," North coach Tom Negoshian said. "Mackler had a big game, and Greg Sitt and Matt Clark off the bench

gave us a big lift. Brian Johns had a great game defensively for us."

"Our goal is to get as high a seed as we can in the (WLLA) playoffs and try to win our division."

W.L. WESTERN 65, FARMINGTON 29: It was close early Tuesday, but the visiting Warriors pulled to their fifth WLLA victory.

"The score was 16-15 and we were up," Farmington coach Steve Korpustik said. "We have stretches where we put things together nicely for 10 to 14 minutes, and then we can't do it. All of a sudden, everything just vanishes on us."

"We do a nice job on the boards and get some scoring opportunities. But then we can't make a shot, and the other team can't miss a shot."

"It's a swift collapse and we find ourselves down by 15, and that's a tough situation for any team."

"I can't help but think, at some point; in one game, we're going to string together 26 to 28 good minutes and give somebody a run."

Dan Zeitlin scored 18 points and Chris Eagle 12 for the Warriors (5-2, 9-5). Robert Nagy had 12 points and seven rebounds to lead the Falcons (0-7, 1-12).

"Ryan Chaitman had a good, all-around game for us," Korpustik said. "He's playing with a lot more confidence. Offensively, he's being more aggressive. Ryan is doing some really nice things for us."

With an 18-6 advantage in the second quarter, Western doubled the score on Farmington at halftime, 32-16. The Warriors were 12-of-16 at the line, the Falcons 7-of-13.

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
