Supporters of later high

"The board is not going to
accept a recommendation that
just says go ahead without paying any attention to the budget,"
said Farmington School Superintendent Bob Marfield. "There

While the district had originally
considered a fall 2002 implementation, the change is now

targeted for the 2003-2004 school year. A committee charged with examining related concerns will still make a recommendation to the board in April; board members are expected to vote on the issue in May.

A public forum is scheduled for p.m. Feb. 28 at the Costick Activities Center on 11 Mile Road in Farmington Hills.

Those who attend will be asked to fill out a survey touching upon preference for high school start times. The survey will also measure the extent to which people are in favor, asking whether they support it if the cost is minimal or only if no programs are cut.
