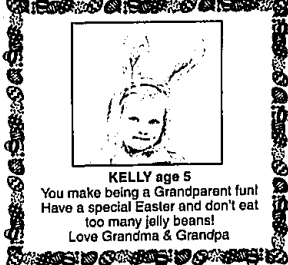

scored all five of his team's overtime points Friday as Livonia Clarenceville, defeated host Bloomfield Hills Cranbrook to win the Metro Conference tournament consolation title.

Silvernail, who had three three-point baskets and six assists, and fellow juniors Pete Shaw and Glenn Garratt scored 12 points apiece.

The 6-foot-6 Garratt led the Trojans with 14 rebounds and 10 blocks. Senior Tim Shaw added nine points and with nine rebounds, and Pete Shaw had eight rebounds and three blocks.

Clarenceville (10-10) was ahead the entire game until late, trailing by two points with eight seconds remaining.

Pete Shaw made a half-court pass to his brother, Tim, who led Garratt for the tying layup with two seconds left.

Garratt was fouled on the play and was at the line with the ball in his hands, according to Clarenceville coach Kevin Murphy, when an official granted a timeout request by Cranbrook, which succeeded in icing Garratt.

Freshman guard Bruno Shkrelli, who moved up from the JV two games ago, chipped in three points and played a good foul game, Murphy said.

Brian Corley scored a game-high 20 points for the Trojans. He had 16 in the fourth quarter in which Cranbrook tallied from a 32-21 deficit, outscored Clarenceville 27-16 and created a 48-48 tie at the end of regulation time.

Bill Blake added 13 points for the Trojans, who made six of 11 free throws. The Trojans, who led at halftime 21-11, were 0-for-9 at the line in the fourth quarter and 3-for-14 overall.

them a 42-38 lead entering the fourth quarter. But the Rocks answered, scoring five-straight — the last of those on a Hoskins slam that put Salem ahead, 43-42 with 5:21 left.

The Rocks' defense continued to harass Glenn, but they couldn't take advantage on the offensive end. A Smith basket with 3:53 to go put the Rockets back on top, but they made only one of their first seven shots in the fourth. Salem, however, would not score again after Hoskins' dunk — at one point watching two point-blank shots roll out.

Another Smith hoop put Glenn up 46-43. Three-point missed by Hoskins and Abraham, followed by two free throws by the Rockets' De'Anthony Granger, sealed the outcome.

Abraham added 14 points for Salem. Wilson had 12 and Jeff Brantley 11 for Glenn.

"A couple of shots go down (late in the game) and we're all right," said Salem coach Bob Brodie. "We didn't finish as well as we should have. I think Glenn played harder than they did the first time, but so did we. That's tenacious defense they played."

HARRISON 63, STEVENSON 51:
A mirror-image.

Or, as Farmington Harrison coach Dave Turnquist described it: "It's like we practice against them every day."

That's how the Hawks handled Livonia Stevenson Wednesday in the WLAAC consolation game at Northville High, building a seven-point lead in the fourth quarter and then holding on for a two-point win.

Harrison finishes its regular season at 11-9. Stevenson is 12-8.

"We match up well with them," said Turnquist. "We play similar styles: straight man-to-man (defense) and a lot of motion (offense)."

Harrison focused its defensive attention on the Spartans' Matt Bartnick and Landon Ivezaj, and it worked. Bartnick scored 12 points, seven in the fourth, and Ivezaj had three. Nicholas Ehrendt led Stevenson with 14.

Harrison got 12 points from Joe McElroy and 11 from Matt Eisey.

The Hawks led 33-25 at the half, but Stevenson halved that deficit by the end of three to 38-34. Free throws aided the Hawks. They converted 21-of-28 at the line (75 percent).
