ALBION SWIMMERS

Albion College placed two swimmers on the All-Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association team. Junior Liz Groth (Bloomfield/Cranbrook-Kingswood) and sophomore Erin Spiro (Farmington/Birmingham) have achieved all-league status for the second time in their careers.

Groth was the runner-up in two individual events at the MIAA Championships last weekend. In the 100-yard backstroke, she touched the wall in 1:00.73. She finished the 200-yard backstroke in 2:11.6.

Spiro was second in three individual events. She set conditionally qualifying times for the NCAA Division III Championships in the 100-yard butterfly (1:00.06) and the 200-yard butterfly (2:10.25). Spiro also touched the wall second in the 200-yard individual medley (2:13.40).

In relays, Groth and Spiro were members of the 200 medley relay team that finished third with a school record time of 1:53.70. Groth and Spiro also swam on the 400 and 800 freestyle relay squads.

"Liz and Erin almost won (their individual events)," Albion head swimming coach Keith Havens said. "They had amazing drops in their times from the preliminaries to the finals. I was pleased with the way they competed."

Hills council gives condo plan approval

The Farmington Hills City Council approved the final preliminary site plan for four single condominium homes to be built at the west side of Goldsmith, north of Eight Mile.

The proposed site condominium project would subdivide a 4.2 acre lot into five lots. The cul-de-sac would have frontage and access to a proposed public road. One lot would retain the existing house that currently exists on the property. The other lots would allow one house per lot.

The proposed "Tom's Forest" project is being developed by Tom Stana.

In other action at its recent meeting, the council:

- Approved appointments to the Homeland Security Council, a committee chaired by Mayor Nancy Bates to devise an emergency preparedness group in the city. Those appointed so far are Judge Fred Harris, Planning Commissioner Shari Garna, Councilwoman Vicki Barnett, Councilman Jon Grant, resident Ken Massey, Police Chief William Dwyer and Deputy Chief Pete Baldwin. Also listed was to be a person chosen from Botsford Hospital and the Farmington school district.
- Approved the following

appointments: Cal Oppenhausser, re-appointed to the Consumer Protection Committee; Larry Hutchinson, appointed to finish a term on the Parks and Recreation Committee, and Ellen Abdu, a member of the Historical Commission.

■ Awarded a bid for the Department of Public Works to buy an excavator from AIS Construction Equipment for \$181,400.

■ Awarded a bid for the DPW to buy two dump trucks from Motor City Trucks for \$203,042.

■ Approved a resolution for dedication of public roads in the Corporate Campus.

■ Approved a public hearing date on March 18 for consideration of various easement vacations in the Glen Acres subdivision and the Glen Acres Subdivision No. 2 (Clairview Street).

■ Approved a March 18 public hearing date for consideration in renaming the easterly portion of Clairview Drive.

■ Approved a special event permit for the Botsford Hospital Employee Bar-B-Que on May 14.

■ Approved the consideration of an ordinance to convey land to Centex Homes regarding the San Marino expansion project.

■ Adjourned the public hearing on the Brownfield development plan for the former National Bantland Property to the council's March 18 meeting.
