"Six years ago my grand-daughter wanted a necklace and I went to Bead Works in Franklin and saw the handbags and have been doing them ever since," said Goldberg. The dolls, you can wear, sit on a chair or hang on the wall. I think they're funky and fun. The heads are made out of Femo clay. Tho body is knitted with arms and legs of glass beads. All carry purses and have a credit card, sunglasses or cell phone in their hands. They're a conversation piece."

Husband and wife artists Al and Joanie Ugelew offer more traditional art. He paints water-color florals and landscapes that foeus on barns, a little French town and doorway in Tuscany. She hand-builds functional and decorative clay bowls, platters and vases.

"The stoneware is free form

decorative clay bowls, platters and vases.

"The stoneware is free form with lots of decoration — a leaf motif or white pine needle imprints glazed with green," said Jonnie, a Troy resident who retired as an English teacher for Warren Consolidated Schools a decade ago. Joanie displays her

work in five shows a year including Oakland Community College's Pottery Show.

"I'll have overything from 5-inch by 5-inch works to bowls 30 inches wide for salads, pastas or to hold water for candles or flowers to float in. I use matte glazes in creme or bronze. Others have a black background with splashes of gold, tend or ivery glazes.

"Since rotiring, clay has brought me a great deal of joy, It allows me to be creative and share my work with people. We're just delighted how they display the artists work in the festival. They coordinate clay with fabric and painting. It has a very professional appearance."

Al Ugelow agrees with his wife that the festival is well managed. The two seem to agree on many topics after 30 years of marriage. Ugelow has been involved with the show longer than that — off and on again for 40 years. Throughout that time he's taken classes at Wayes State University and with Ochinpelli and Jonn Braummeister at Niles Community Center in Troy.



the opportunity (for artists) to have things there that people can buy right away and not have to go to the bank," said Ugelow who retired from teaching psychology at Oakland Community College in Highland Lakes in 1988.

Making the arts attractive to the community is what Martha Cormic tried to do during her 15 years as chairperson of the festival, a major fund-raiser for the church. Twenty porcent of the sales go to outrench programs which includes housing a group of homeless people at the church for a week.

"Pastor Tom Stahl felt we had a lot of talent in the community and wanted to start a community enrichment program and familiarize the community with our small church to show there are different ways of looking at religion," said Cormic of Boverly Hills. "In the early years we only had 20 artists but always set it up as a gallery. I'm excited the reputation of the Nativity festival has reached a broader audience of artists and outgrown the church fair image."
