care of ourselves and not getting caught up in the meet.

"We're just focusing on what we have to do and not being afraid of that level of competition. That's where our experience helps."

Tri-Farmington's Clara Seymour was the Division 1 all-around regional champion with her highest score as a high school gymnast at 37.75.

Teammates Chelsea Keesling and Sara Houchins were second (37.55) and fourth (37.20), respectively, causing Dwyer to comment: "It was almost like a dream meet."

Seymour, who won the all-around for the first time in a major meet, also took first place in the bars (9.5) and beam (9.55) competitions, and she was fourth in vault (9.2) and floor exercise (9.5).

"She looked more relaxed and just very confident," Dwyer said. "It was just a good meet for her. Everything was on. It was her day to shine. She certainly deserved it with all the work she puts in."

The top six all-arounders from each regional and top eight in the individuals events qualify for the state meet.

In Division II, Kristin Ulewicz was fourth with her best all-around score (35.80). Lindsay Smith ninth (35.10) and Dayna Warheit 13th (34.40).

Dwyer said it was a team effort, citing contributions from Samantha Sherry, Natalie Olesko, Anne Lieberman, Lauren Karez and Sarah Hargitt. "Our fourth, fifth and sixth positions in each event were huge," Dwyer said. "When they

hit like they did and the upper girls hit, (the judges) have to give them the scores."

"I believe the girls deserved it. They started off with solid routines and were getting high eight. Then Chelsea, Clara and Sara came up, and they have to reward them for their difficulty."

"We were just solid. That was a solid, team effort. That was our goal at the beginning of the year. Our goal was to win the regional and try to win state."

Tri-Farmington had team scores of 37.40 on beam, 38.05 on floor and 36.65 on bars and vault.

"The judges commented the girls looked good," Dwyer said. "They weren't just doing a job; they were performing. They're starting to be rewarded for the art side of it, too."

"They're not just grinding it out. They're smiling while they're working, and we worked on that during the year. They're selling their routines."

bounds off a Roosevelt spike.

"We've done it all year," Perrin said of his team's resiliency. "They're a team that doesn't rattle. They're used to a team making a run, and it doesn't bother them."

"We have a lot of seniors and strong leaders. Until the other team scores 15 points, they haven't won yet, so we keep playing."

Kimmel served 16 of 24 points with four aces, and she had five digs in the final. Jocelyn Atkins had four kills and three blocks;

Randin Brown had nine assists and three digs; Deanna Gauer had two kills and three solo blocks; Jessica Janowicz had two kills and two digs, and Meghan Young had seven digs, one kill and one block.

"We're two evenly-matched teams," Perrin said, adding "one play or call here or there" separated them. "Mercy is a very good team and is deserving of the district championship."

In its first match, Farmington crushed Southfield-Lathrup, 15-1, 15-6. Melissa Patterson had three

kills and three digs for the Falcons.

In the other semifinal, Farmington sandwiched a pair of 16-2 wins around a 13-15 loss in the second game to Berkeley.

"It was a complete lack of focus," Perrin said, adding the Falcons were up 13-9 in the second game.

"We were in control and I don't know if we relaxed or they played really well, or if it was a combina-

tion of the two.

"There was no sense of panic going into the third game. Sometimes you just need a little wake-up call."

Kimmel had seven kills, seven aces and 15 digs in the Berkeley match; Gauer had seven kills and four blocks; Janowicz had six kills and four blocks; Brown had 22 assists and nine digs; Young had 15 digs, 10 kills and three blocks; and Atkins had four blocks and

11 kills.

The Falcons finished what "has to be one of the finer seasons in Farmington history," according to Perrin, with a 40-16 record.

Nine of their losses were to state-rated teams, and seven occurred when the Falcons were missing starters due to injury or illness.

"We're a tough team to beat when we're all there and ready to play," Perrin said.
