Rogowski was a key member of CC's amazing Division I state football champions — but he went through the playoffs with a hernia that he underwent surgery shortly after quarterback Tom Jakacki hit wide receiver Ryan Wrobleski with the short touchdown pass that gave the Shamrocks their championship.

"Coming from nothing and winning it, doing it with my best friends, no one can ever take that away from me. 'I couldn't miss the end of the playoffs. So I had it (the hernia surgery) done afterward. That was the only time I could have had it done. So I missed the first month of the (wrestling) season.
