Officials learn about national issues

Members of the Farmington Hills City Council attended a four-day conference at the nation's copital in early March to learn more about national legislative issues and policies that could affect the city. Hills Mayor Nancy Bates and councilwoman Vicki Barnett arrived a day earlier than council members Barry Brickner, Jerry Ellis, Christopher McRae and Jon Grant, to serve on committees.

"It was a good conference," Bates said of the National League of Cites Legislative Corrence in Washington, D.C.. She plans to use the information she learned about hemeland security with a new committee she is spearheading. The goal is to have a Hills homeland security plan in place to cope with any large-scale disasters. She plans to conduct the committee's first meeting soon as other city administrators gather more information about the subject.

Bates said the conference is a way for city officials to learn the latest news about legislative
