Church laws, but not Bible, ban marriages between first cousins

Must first cousins be forbidden

Must trate cousins be forbidden to marry?

In the Bible, and in many parts of the world, the answer is no. But the answer is yes in much of church law and in half the 50 United States.

This issue became news whon the April issue of the Journal of Genetic Counseling said risks have been exaggerated for serious birth defects, retardation or genetic diseases among children of first-cousin marriages.

Generally, an unrelated couple has a 3 percent to 4 percent risk of having a child with such problems, while marriages of close cousins add 1.7 percent to 2.8 percent to the risk. Genetic problems are considerably higher with the forms of close inhreeding that the Bible forbids and secular culture abhors as "incest." First cousins cannot marry under the age-old laws of the Roman Catholic and Eastern Orthodox churchea, covering much of world Christendom.
