won the pole vault and was a part of each winning relay.

Other individual winners for the Raiders were Darwin Young, Eugene Franklin, Brian Johns, Justin Cook, Jeff Shumer, Eugene Furman and Jeff Mataya.

"I saw some great effort in our kids fighting hard through the finish," Simpson said. "There were a lot of guys picking up third and fourth places that meant points we didn't expect. Those kids were fighting hard and doing everything they could to win the city championship."

"That's our goal every year. We always circle the city meet as one of the big meets. The kids look forward to it; the coaching staff points to it."

"After what we felt was a mediocre effort Thursday, I think our kids really responded to the challenge of the city meet."

The Raiders won every field event and had earned 21 of a possible 22 points, giving them a good start and momentum heading into the running events.

"The kids competed well and put the time in to master the technique," Simpson said. "It's paying off and they're giving us great starts in meets."

"I think all four relays ran great races. We came up a little

short in the 3,200, but we ran a decent time. The sprint relays ran really well. They competed and wanted to win the city championship plaques."

Like the North boys, the Harrison girls rebounded from a disappointing effort in a dual meet two days earlier to have what Babcock thought might have been their best performance of the year.

"The thing that was different this year was coming off a disappointing performance," he said. "I think it made for a sense of urgency for us to step up and perform much, much better."

"We have good kids and a good team. Hopefully, we're back to where we should be and it's onward and upward from here."

Harrison's Latoya Burrell had four first places, and other individual winners for the Hawks were Tanya Hicks, Tarin Dew, Julieta Larina, Krystal Wise and Christine Metry.

Wise, Farmington's Betty Wade and North's Susan Barrows were double individual winners. The Hawks also swept first place in the relays, as well as the shuttle hurdle relay.

"One of our goals was to win the four relays, plus the shuttle hurdles, because it was a big thing to win all the plaques and city championships," Babcock said.

"That was the thing we were pushing for and we ran good times. Latoya had a terrific day all the way around."

Despite the point differential, it was still a competitive, spirited meet, Babcock said.

"Everybody was giving a great effort," he said. "I've been following the North and Farmington times and they ran well, too."

"The meet brought out the best in all of us. Farmington did some really good things, too, and so did North."
