

Falcons edge Vikings, 1-0

One goal was all that was needed Monday.

That was enough to give visiting Farmington a 1-0 victory over Wallied Lake Central in girls soccer.

"We just have a scoring problem," Falcons coach Steve Montgomery said. "We totally dominated the game. I feel good about

everything but the score. But we did win. Whether we win 5-0 or 1-0, it doesn't matter."

Joyce Ross scored the lone goal four minutes into the second half with an assist from Katie Johnson.

The Falcons, who had 23 shots on goal, moved the ball and had most of the possessions, according to Montgomery.

Farmington goalkeeper Kate Kelly earned her fourth shutout of the season, making five saves. The Falcons, who are 2-1-1 in the Lakes Division of the Western Lakes Activities Association and 4-2-1 overall, were minus senior forward Julie Gottlicher, who was ill and didn't play.

"There was never really a time I was worried, even though the score was 1-0," Montgomery said. "We just seem to have difficulty putting the ball in the net."

"It's not like we didn't have good opportunities. It's finishing we have difficulty with."

"I'm very happy with how we played. The defense was very involved in the offense. We were moving the ball very confidently and getting shots. But they were either at the keeper, or she would make a great save."

MARIAN 3, MERCY 2: The Marlins rolled from a 2-0 halftime deficit Tuesday to tie the score. But the Mustangs got the winning goal with less than 10 minutes left to play.

Katie Fuller scored the first Mercy goal with an assist by Jessica Greeney, and Kristin Whalen scored the second off a direct kick.

"It was just a great, well-played game," Mercy coach Tania MacCoe said. "We had a great second-half effort. Toward the end we turned it on and created a lot of opportunities, but we just ran out of time."

Monisha Berkowski and Megan Garagala split time in goal for Mercy, which was 3-4 in the Catholic League Central Division and 3-4-1 overall going into a Wednesday game with Bishop Foley.

STEVENSON 10, HARRISON 0: Melissa Dobbey pumped in five goals and added two assists Monday as Livonia Stevenson (6-3-1) rolled to a WLAAC crossover victory over host Farmington Harrison (3-6-1).

Lia Williamson, Jamie Radley and Jamie Horrick each added a goal and assist for the Spartans, who led 6-0 at halftime. The game was stopped due to the 10-goal mercy rule with 25 minutes left.

Danielle Lewis and Megan McConnell also added goals for the Spartans, who are 6-0 in the Western Lakes and 0-3-1 outside the WLAAC.

"We haven't played well in the last two games, and tonight we put forth a much better effort," Harrison coach Stacy Lange-Punzel said, "even though it was not enough to beat (Stevenson)."

"Even though I'm disappointed with the loss, I think we're making progress. A game like this can be a learning experience when you have young players who're trying to develop."

Stacey Potrykus and Veen Vunlig played well for the Hawks in the midfield, Lange-Punzel added.

Leanne Burns scored the lone goal (unassisted) in a 9-1 loss to Wallied Lake Western on April 24, and Harrison lost a makeup game Friday to West Bloomfield, 6-0.

TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF OAKLAND COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICT

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that the Regular Biennial Election of Oakland Community College shall be held on Monday, June 10, 2002, in conjunction with the regular elections of component school districts. At this election, two (2) candidates will be elected to serve on the Oakland Community College Board of Trustees for regular 6-year terms beginning July 1, 2002 and ending June 30, 2008.

Act 116, Public Acts of Michigan, 1954, as amended, provides in part as follows:

The inspectors of election at an election or primary election in this state, or in a district, county, township, city or village in this state, shall not receive the vote of a person whose name is not registered in the registration book or listed on the computer registration precinct list of the township, ward, or precinct in which he offers to vote...

The last day for receiving registrations for this election will be Monday, May 13, 2002. Persons residing in the Oakland Community College District, shall not receive the vote of a person whose name is not registered in the registration book or listed on the computer registration precinct list of the township, ward, or precinct in which he offers to vote...

Effective April 1, 2000, Public Act 18 of 1999 amended the Michigan Vehicle Code to correspond a person's voter registration address with the person's driver's license address. An address change submitted by an individual to update his or her driver license record will automatically carry over to the individual's voter registration record.

Please take further notice that only registered electors residing in the Oakland Community College area of any component school district will be eligible to vote at the regular biennial election of Oakland Community College.
