

Gaines receives another honor

University of Vermont men's basketball co-captain Trevor Gaines of Farmington Hills received the J. Edward Donnelly Award as the school's top senior male athlete Wednesday at the UVM senior awards dinner.

MEN'S HOOP

The Catamounts won a school-record 21 games in 2001-02.

He was a unanimous first-team selection to the America East All-Conference squad and earned a spot on the all-tournament team this year. He also was named the America East Most Valuable Player by collegeinsider.com, a national college basketball website.

Trevor's everyday work ethic and enthusiasm rubbed off on everyone associated with the program. "Vermont coach Tom Brennan said, 'He not only made the program better, he made the University and the community a better place.'"

Gaines was a member of the

conference all-rookie team as a freshman and was one of the conference's most improved players as a sophomore. In each of his final three seasons, he ranked among the conference leaders in rebounding, scoring and field goal percentage.

As a senior, he led America East in rebounding, ranked sixth in scoring and was second in field goal percentage. Gaines closed out his senior season finishing seventh among the Division I national leaders in rebounding as well as the national leader in offensive rebounds.

In 2001-02, he recorded 17 double-doubles, breaking Kevin Robertson's single-season record set in 1992. He also was named the MVP of the FIU Holiday Classic, Vermont's first in-season tournament title against an all-Division I field.

He finished third all-time at UVM with 882 rebounds (10th in America East history) and 13th in scoring with 1,236 points. He also is the top five in field goals, field goal percentage, and games played.

Gaines is a two-time winner of the team's Thomas O'Shea Award for exemplary dedication, courage and commitment to the program. He was a three-time America East Academic Honor Roll selection and received the UVM Athletic Council Award for Academic Improvement twice.

He will graduate later this month with his degree in Community Development and Applied Economics and wishes to continue playing basketball as a professional.

Raiders dominate game with Hawks

North Farmington had a dominating performance at both ends of the field Wednesday while rolling to an 8-0 victory over Farmington Harrison in girls soccer.

"It was incredibly gratifying to

have Meghan back in the middle," he said. "Her return combined with very steady play by Munaco totally opened up our offense."

At forward, Nicole Adena was all over the place. In addition to her three goals, she put a hard shot off the crossbar, and a few others just off net. Her seven goals thus far lead the team.

"Sara Jakob had her best game to date, with solid trapping, passing and runs off the ball. Our offense was clicking on all cylinders, at least, once we got going. Following a slow start, we began putting in headers, one-time volleys, accurate bending shots, and lasers. Few of our goals were cheap."

At the end of both the first and second halves we played all of our reserves. I'm very happy they stepped right in and stuck with our game plan.

"There was little, if any, drop in productivity when they played. This certainly bodes well for next season."

FARMINGTON 8, W. BLOOMFIELD 4: Erica Rose scored three goals Friday night to lead the visiting Falcons to a non-league victory over the Lakers. Maria Lockhart and Stephanie Arnold

also scored a goal for Farmington, which led 2-0 at halftime and improved its overall record to 5-4-1. Erin Daroo assisted on two goals, and Joyce Ross and Stephanie Ross had one assist each. Kate Kelly made six saves in goal. Farmington led 5-0 when West Bloomfield scored.

"I thought we controlled most of the play," Farmington coach Steve Montgomery said. "It was a total team involvement. Once we started making a lot of short passes instead of long passes, things started going our way."

"And everyone on the team played quite a bit. I'm just happy with the result and the fact we scored some goals. We didn't waste a lot of shots. Our attempts were down, but the goals were up."

On Wednesday, the Farmington lost a Western Lakes game to state-ranked Northville, 5-0. The Falcons were without Julie Goettlicher and Daroo, due to illness.

"Without Julie and Erin, it made it a lot tougher for us, but Northville is a great team," Montgomery said. "They have great ball control and passing. They have at least four go-to players." "They scored late in both halves. We held them down for quite a while. They had 23 players on their roster and sub frequently, and they don't lose any strength when they sub. You can't play defense all day and expect to win, and Julie is our No. 1 forward."
