My two older children are just starting to like the sport. When one of them has an "off" day on the court, he might not jump at the chance to go to the next week's lesson. But I encourage him to get out there and try again.

When we're not good at something, we lack confidence and self-estrem. We shy away from

The key is to try something more than once. If the first experience left an unfavorable impression, try it again. Maybe the surrounding circumstances contributed to the lack of success. We might retreat when a mentor or peer infers we need more work on something. Perhaps we blame our lack of interest on age - the older we get, the more often we gravitate to what we're good at and refrain from what we're not. Teacher falls under a par-

Teacher falls under a par-ent's "job description." My chil-

dren and I talk about how there is nothing wrong with making a mistake because you just get right back up and keep trying. I'm not concerned about how well they think I can ski. I think it's good for everyone in my family to see each other learn new skills.

Some of my family may be better at one thing, while the rest of us are good at nonther. I'm more interested in helping my children learn something they have a possion for as an early age. The last thing I want to do is hold them back because I'm not good at something and don't want them to see me make a mistake.

There is no such thing as

being embarrassed on the ski hill or elsewhere. Weak skills make strong lessons about working harder next time to focus on what went wrong and how to correct it. Practice, hard work and experience breed success. Most of my family isn't quite so adventurous about water skiing yet . . . maybe that's something my husband will teach us to try again this sum-mer!
