## Thomas Tattan hired as superintendent

Waterford Schools may offi-cially extend a warm welcome to soon-to-be Superintendent Dr. Thomas Tata.

In a swift motion at the start of Thursday's Board of Educa-tion meeting, Tattan was hired to succeed Howard Heltzeg, who retired from the position on Feb. 28, and the current acting super-intendent, Carol Dowsett.

He comes to Waterford from Clarenceville School District, which includes parts of Livonia, Redford and Farmington Hills.
A short reception was held at the Waterford Administration

Building in Tattan's honor before the meeting. Once the motion to hire him was made by Trustee Brian Whiston, and supported across the board, Tattan received a standing ovation.

"I really want to thank the Board of Education," said Tattan on Friday. "I will carn their respect and appreciation as we work together to make (Waterford) the best district it can be in Oakland County."

Board president, John Himmelspach, said that Tattan was chosen based on his ability, personality and the board's own desire to hire him. Himmelspach said their faith in him was represented in the unanimous vote.

Tattan currently resides in Northville and has no plans to relocate at this time. He said he will miss the employees of the Claronceville School District when he leaves. "I've got a lot of friends here," he said.

After six years he has established "a quality team" that has made the district a success. Prior to his work as a superintendent for Clarenceville, Tattan worked in the larger Plymouth/Canton School District.

"It's all about people and the relationships you have with them," said Tattan. "Thut's what I'm interested in."

Whiston kept the momentum of the evening going strong by

making a motion to grant Tattan a 4-year contract worth \$134,696.15 with the school district. The motion was supported by Trustee Stanley Kurzman, who, along with Himmelspach, worked to negotiate a contract for the position.


The base salary will be \$150,000, compared to the former Superintendent Howard Heitzeg's base of \$161,000. Heitzeg held the position for 8 years. Whiston noted that the salary is below average compared to surrounding districts, which pay about \$188,000.

Tattan will begin his new position as Waterford Schools Superintendent on July 1.
