The secretary noticed a "Spy Agent" program, which has the ability to capture passwords, was installed on some of the systems. The incident was recorded May 14. Fifteen computers had to be reconfigured, and the staff at the school was advised to change passwords. The school is seeking prosecution against the boy.
