Sewer expenditures for the coming year will increase reflecting Detroit charges and local maintenance costs. The local sewer rate recommendation is an increase from \$2.71 per \$1.000 to \$3.17 per 1,000 gallons.

"The cost to each Farmington customer will be \$5.66 per quarter for fiscal year 2002-2003," Lauhoff said. "The cost will be neighsted annually."

The city provides sower service to two districts. The rates for each district are different as city costs are different. In the case of the Farmington Sewer District to autside customers, a major portion of the sewer improvements in this district are being paid through local property taxes, whereas residents in the City of Farmington Hills are not subject to the tax, Lauhoff said. "Their sewer rates reflect an amount that is equal to that which they would have paid in property taxes to offset the cost of the new sewer improvements from which they benefit." Lauhoff said. The cost of construction water and pool fills has also been modified to reflect the additional costs of the product."
