Many bowlers put the equip-ment away until the fall season is ready to start, others bowl in summer leagues or at least get in some off-season practice.

is ready to start, others bowl in summer legages or at least get in some off-season practice. Either way, it is most important to keep the legs in good shape for the coming season. This advice is good for everyhody, young and old, male or female.

The weakest part of the legs are usually the knees. They are often the first to go and affect your delivery.

My advisor says to get a pair of ankle weights, usually about two or three pounds, and strap the to the ankles.

Then, you can sit upright and os some lower leg lifts, being sure to move slowly to make the muscles around the knee do more work.

This will build the supporting

This will build the supporting muscle tissue and help prevent further knee trouble.

Secondly, keep the weights on and do some leg flexors for the upper thighs.

Again, move slowly to get the muscles working, use a short range of movement and be able to feel the leg muscles doing their work.

Exercise as often and as long as you can without hurting. At the first sign of pain, quit and start again the next day.

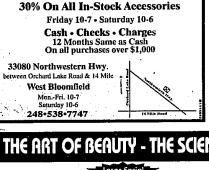
