Check scam targets used car sellers

Farmington Hills Police are warning residents of a new scam that is preying upon peo-ple selling used vehicles. The department is investi-gating two complaints from Hills residents who had adver-tised their cars for sale in the Tradin Times.

tradin' Timenlaints, the sell-ers were contacted by a woman posing as a buyer. The suspect gave a fake name and negotiated a sales price over the phone. She then met with the sellers

at their homes and presented each with what turned out to be a counterfeit eashier's check drawn out of Comeriea Bank. Each check appeared legitimate and had been completely lilled out by a computer with the exception of the line after "Pay to the Order of." After meeting with the seller's, the suspect would hand write the seller's name in that space.

when the sellers attempted to cash the checks, they were told they were counterfeit. In each complaint, the suspect urrived at the seller's home with a black man driving

type vehicle. In both cases, a rear hatch was up to conceal the license plate.

The man remained in the Explorer at all times.

The woman is described as black, heavy-set at about 230-240 pounds, about 30 years old with a light complexion.

The department offers these tips to avoid being scammed.

A true cashier's check will be completely filled out, including the 'Pay to the Order' space. Do not accept a cashier's check that is not completely filled out.

If possible, contact the

bank or credit union where the check was drawn from and ver-

price or a used car before secing it.

If taking a check, try to get
as much information from the,
buyer as possible.

Ask to see the person's driver's license, write down his or
her full name, date of birth,
address, and phone number.
