

# NBA 76ers' Coleman arrested for drunk driving, faces prelim

NBA forward Derrick Coleman of the Philadelphia 76ers is expected to have a pre-trial hearing at 2 p.m. Aug. 16 before Judge Frederick Harris in Farmington's 47th District Court for drunken driving and refusing a breathalyzer test.

According to a Hills police report, Coleman of Detroit was driving his 2003 Land Rover station wagon in excess of 120 mph on I-696 near I-275 around 3:30 a.m. Saturday. The speed limit is 70 mph.

Police followed the vehicle for about three miles before Coleman stopped. Officers smelled intoxicants on his breath, and he told them he had "a couple glasses of champagne" and was on his way home.

The athlete refused to take a breath test at least three times, the report stated. A warrant for a blood test was authorized and Coleman gave blood at Botsford Hospital at 5:50 a.m. Because of the refusal, Coleman's license is automatically suspended for six months, said Police Chief William Dwyer.
