Fashion: By the Book

Fashion is more for looking than looking, but there are at least a few titles out there: *Louis Comfort Tiffany at Tiffany & Co.* (Harry N. Abrams, \$60 hardcover, November), by John Loring, focuses on the celebrated art nouveau designer's legacy of jewelry, enamels, and precious objects during his tenure as design director for the jewelry company between 1902 and 1918.

This is the fourth book devoted to Tiffany by Loring, the company's current design director. Tie-dyed fabrics weren't just a 1960s novelty craze; creating interesting textures by bunching or otherwise manipulating fabrics before dying has a long history across many cultures. *Memory on Cloth: Shibori Now* (Kodansha International, \$80 hardcover), by Yoshiko Iwamoto Wada, describes these along with her focus on Shibori, the Japanese tradition of resist-dyeing. Wada, who has taught the art and technique around the

world, describes how it's done and how today's designers have been using it. Something you might try yourself is creating jewelry and other objects from beads. You can advance past the Girl Scout hobby class to professional level with *Antique Style Bead Accessories* (Japan Publications, \$16.95 paperback), by Matsuoka Sawanobori. The author shows examples and gives instructions for necklaces, rings, hair ornaments, et al. from glass, crystal and metal beads, pearls and stones.

Made in Britain (Mitchell Beazley, \$45 hardcover, October), by Catherine McDermott, looks at the evolution of British style from classic tailoring to punk, as well as the rise of British designers such as Timothy Everest, Alexander McQueen and Vivienne Westwood. Several sewing standbys have been reissued as paperbacks by Taunton: *Power Sewing Step-by-Step* (\$24.95), by Sandra Betzina; *Fabric Savvy* (\$17.95), also by Betzina; and *Sewing for Plus Sizes* (\$17.95), by Barbara Declert.

'Cold Company' has chills and thrills aplenty

Cold Company (Morrow, 294 pages, \$23.95) by Sue Henry

Sue Henry's latest mystery, *Cold Company*, is the perfect escape for a hot summer day. Set in the Alaskan wilderness, the story finds famed "musher" Jessie Arnold busy rebuilding her home, which had been destroyed by an arsonist, when the reconstruction uncovers the skeleton of an old man.

The mystery deepens as authorities try to link a necklace found with the skeleton to a woman believed murdered by a serial killer decades earlier. When the body of a local woman is found floating in a river, police fear there's a copycat. Worse yet, the killer may be stalking Jessie, who decides to do some investigating of her own. Although the police urge her not to stay alone at night at the construction site, the fiercely independent sled dog owner

refuses to leave (which should not surprise readers of previous Jessie Arnold mysteries). Henry does an excellent job of building suspense about the murderer's identity. But it's her detailed descriptions of the characters and the countryside

— particularly the final confrontation with the killer — that will keep readers turning the pages. With its twists and turns and fast-paced action, *Cold Company* provides plenty of thrills and chills.
