City DDA to continue hiring process

The Farmington Downtown Development Authority board voted Wednesday to continue the process to hire a new executive director, though three of 10 semifinalists have withdrawn. The board instructed DDA Director Judy Downey to contact five executive recruitment/ consultant firms. Downey,

who will retire by the beginning of next year, has held her position for 10 years. The DDA director plans and coordinates activities in the downtown area. The position will pay \$47,000-\$33,000. The search firms are: Municipal Consulting Services, MML, Ann Arbor; Plante & Moran, LLF, Southfield; The Rehmann Group, LLC, Troy; Tem Dority & Associates, Inc., Lansing; and Langworthy, Strader, Leblane & Associates, Inc., Royal Oak.
