You want to adjust the lens before filming to give the viewers a more dramatic result. If you want to get closer, we suggest simply walking closer.

2. Keep shots short.

3. Don't get the jitters. If your S. Don't get the pitters. It your camera has a steady feature built into it, use it. The jitterier your camera the more chances are the viewers will be quick to turn if off from motion sickness. Use a tripod or rest your camera on a table top or chair.

4. Use different angles. The use of different angles 4. Use different angles. The use of different angles creates greater interest for the viewer. Don't be afraid to get in and capture the emotion that is conveyed. The typical approach to take is to start with an opening wide shot then move in to a medium shot then go for the close up.

medium shot then go for the close up. 5. Be heard. Audio is the weakest part of video. If you

can't hear the action when you're shooting video, then you're probably not close enough. Most microphones are mounted on top of the camera. The best way to record audio is to move closer to the object and zoom out wide. To hear the best level of sound we recommend beadshones.


