because he is moving on to a new phase.

"He's doing things to make his life better," McShane said. "As Frank has told me, the average city manager stays about five years, and we've had you for 10 years. We've been blessed with so many wonderful programs. There are so many things we are proud of, and I hope you carry those wonderful things in your heart."

She mentioned the city-owned, historic Civic Theatre and the city's road program.

"The city has been more than lucky," said councilwoman Mary Bush. "I envy you, in a way. You are starting a whole new life."

Council members Arnold Campbell and Mike Harrison were absent.

DDA President Ron Oglesby thanked Lauhoff for his guidance. Director Judy Downey credited Lauhoff's open door policy. "If he didn't have a meeting, his door was open," Downey said.

Lauhoff was appointed Farmington City Manager in January 1994, replacing former City Manager Bob Dealman.

Lauhoff rose through the ranks of the public safety department, starting as a public safety officer in July 1974.

He was appointed Farmington Director of Public Safety in 1984, after promotion to deputy director of public safety in 1982 and his first promotion to shift commander in 1978.

While director of public safety, he held positions on the board of directors of the Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police and the Southeastern Michigan Association of Chiefs of Police Association. He also was a member of the Michigan Municipal Risk Management Association Law Enforcement Committee.

Throughout his career he was a member of the Farmington/Farmington Hills Exchange Club and the Farmington/Farmington Hills Optimist Club.

He was involved in subcommittee work as a member of the Michigan Municipal League, while maintaining professional memberships in other national, state and local organizations.

Born in Mt. Clemens, Mich., Lauhoff holds a bachelor of science degree in criminal justice from Madonna University.
